ICD-10-CM codes (2016 to 2017): Dx T43.6; a 5th/6th character of 1-unintentional, 2-intentional self-harm, 3-assault, or 4-undetermined intent; a 7th character of A-initial encounter, D-subsequent encounter, or missing.

ICD-9-CM codes (2008 to 2014): Dx 969.7 or ecode E854.2 (Accidental).

Notes: In 2014, a new data file structure was provided by the SCHS and NCHA, which included additional diagnosis code fields. It is unclear how this impacts trend data. Please interpret trends with caution.
